In the order from the 6th of this current month, the Commander General warns me of the following:

In the same terms that have been admitted to that province [for] the other Indian tribes that were dependent on the government of New Orleans when Louisiana belonged to the king, our Lord, you may allow the transfer to those territories of the Pascagula, Elnacuias, Charquias, and guapanasgue who have requested to verify it according to your honor, who informed me in letter number 600 of last September 4 with reference to the one that the commander of Nagodoches sent you, along with the report understood by D Samuel Davenport, but I warn your honor that regarding the determination of the country in which they should settle, keep in mind the orders communicated on the matter for the other tribes that have emigrated.

What I transfer to your mercy so that for your part you may have the punctual due compliance that corresponds, keeping in mind the orders cited by the Commander General that all exist in that file.

May God keep you at your mercy for many years. Bexar October 30, 1807
